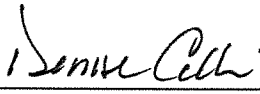

RECOMMENDATION:

Form an irrevocable trust for management of the OPEB Liability.

Approve the Adoption Agreement for OPEB Trust Services with PARS; and authorize the Accounting Manager / Treasurer to enter into such an agreement.

Authorization to make the initial contribution to the Trust of \$1,196,266.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW:

In 2004, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) issued Statement No. 45 which requires the District to disclose in its financial statements information regarding funding, costs and provisions for Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB). GASB Statement No. 75 replaces GASB Statement No. 45 and must be implemented by June 15, 2017.

An actuarial study was performed in 2015, and thereafter every two years to determine the District's liability and annual required contribution (ARC). The actuarial determines the OPEB liability which represents benefits earned for past service as of the study date. The ARC is comprised of the amortization of the liability for past service plus the estimated benefits earned in the current fiscal year. As of June 30, 2016 the District ARC is \$1,196,266., the total Net OPEB obligation is \$9,049,748., the District has Designated Reserves for OPEB of \$4,134,100.

While not a requirement of GASB No. 75, establishing a third party irrevocable trust provides certain benefits:

1. Trust assets can be managed for investment purposes to achieve a higher rate of return, thus lowering the District's future ARC.
2. Rating agencies perceive the Trust more favorably than earmarking funds within the District's pooled cash and investments (Designated Reserves).
3. Once placed into a trust, the money cannot be diverted to other purposes, nor is it subject to possible other financial claims of the District.

4. Contributions into Trust are “assets” that offset liabilities on financial statements
5. The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) recommends prefunding OPEB and considers it “best practice”.
6. OPEB assets are accessible for OPEB expenses at any time.

The Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS) is a long-time provider that specializes in creating OPEB Trusts for local governments. PARS serves as the Plan Administrator of the Trust and has partnered with Union Bank of California as Trustee.

An OPEB Trust Agreement would include a separate investment policy designed to guide the third party investment manager toward achieving the desired return on investment. The goal of the OPEB Trust is to maximize return over the long-term horizon of 30 years, subject to risk and quality constraints set forth in the policy.

AGREEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

This agreement (“Agreement”) is made this ____ day of _____, 2017, between Phase II Systems, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, doing business as Public Agency Retirement Services and PARS (hereinafter “PARS”) and the Casitas Municipal Water District (“Agency”).

WHEREAS, the Agency has adopted the PARS Public Agencies Post-Employment Benefits Trust for the purpose of pre-funding pension obligations and/or OPEB obligations (“Plan”), and is desirous of retaining PARS as Trust Administrator to the Trust, to provide administrative services.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree:

1. **Services.** PARS will provide the services pertaining to the Plan as described in the exhibit attached hereto as “Exhibit 1A” (“Services”) in a timely manner, subject to the further provisions of this Agreement.
2. **Fees for Services.** PARS will be compensated for performance of the Services as described in the exhibit attached hereto as “Exhibit 1B”.
3. **Payment Terms.** Payment for the Services will be remitted directly from Plan assets unless the Agency chooses to make payment directly to PARS. In the event that the Agency chooses to make payment directly to PARS, it shall be the responsibility of the Agency to remit payment directly to PARS based upon an invoice prepared by PARS and delivered to the Agency. If payment is not received by PARS within thirty (30) days of the invoice delivery date, the balance due shall bear interest at the rate of 1.5% per month. If payment is not received from the Agency within sixty (60) days of the invoice delivery date, payment plus accrued interest will be remitted directly from Plan assets, unless PARS has previously received written communication disputing the subject invoice that is signed by a duly authorized representative of the Agency.
4. **Fees for Services Beyond Scope.** Fees for services beyond those specified in this Agreement will be billed to the Agency at the rates indicated in the PARS’ standard fee schedule in effect at the time the services are provided and shall be payable as described in Section 3 of this Agreement. Before any such services are performed, PARS will provide the Agency with a detailed description of the services, terms, and applicable rates for such services. Such services, terms, and applicable rates shall be agreed upon in writing and executed by both parties.
5. **Information Furnished to PARS.** PARS will provide the Services contingent upon the Agency’s providing PARS the information specified in the exhibit attached hereto as “Exhibit 1C” (“Data”). It shall be the responsibility of the Agency to certify the accuracy, content and completeness of the Data so that PARS may rely on such information without further audit. It shall further be the responsibility of the Agency to deliver the Data to PARS in such a manner that allows for a reasonable amount of time for the Services to be performed. Unless specified in Exhibit 1A, PARS shall be under no duty to question Data received from the Agency, to compute contributions made to the

Plan, to determine or inquire whether contributions are adequate to meet and discharge liabilities under the Plan, or to determine or inquire whether contributions made to the Plan are in compliance with the Plan or applicable law. In addition, PARS shall not be liable for non performance of Services to the extent such non performance is caused by or results from erroneous and/or late delivery of Data from the Agency. In the event that the Agency fails to provide Data in a complete, accurate and timely manner and pursuant to the specifications in Exhibit 1C, PARS reserves the right, notwithstanding the further provisions of this Agreement, to terminate this Agreement upon no less than ninety (90) days written notice to the Agency.

6. **Records.** Throughout the duration of this Agreement, and for a period of five (5) years after termination of this Agreement, PARS shall provide duly authorized representatives of Agency access to all records and material relating to calculation of PARS' fees under this Agreement. Such access shall include the right to inspect, audit and reproduce such records and material and to verify reports furnished in compliance with the provisions of this Agreement. All information so obtained shall be accorded confidential treatment as provided under applicable law.
7. **Confidentiality.** Without the Agency's consent, PARS shall not disclose any information relating to the Plan except to duly authorized officials of the Agency, subject to applicable law, and to parties retained by PARS to perform specific services within this Agreement. The Agency shall not disclose any information relating to the Plan to individuals not employed by the Agency without the prior written consent of PARS, except as such disclosures may be required by applicable law.
8. **Independent Contractor.** PARS is and at all times hereunder shall be an independent contractor. As such, neither the Agency nor any of its officers, employees or agents shall have the power to control the conduct of PARS, its officers, employees or agents, except as specifically set forth and provided for herein. PARS shall pay all wages, salaries and other amounts due its employees in connection with this Agreement and shall be responsible for all reports and obligations respecting them, such as social security, income tax withholding, unemployment compensation, workers' compensation and similar matters.
9. **Indemnification.** PARS and Agency hereby indemnify each other and hold the other harmless, including their respective officers, directors, employees, agents and attorneys, from any claim, loss, demand, liability, or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, incurred by the other as a consequence of, to the extent, PARS' or Agency's, as the case may be, negligent acts, errors or omissions with respect to the performance of their respective duties hereunder.
10. **Compliance with Applicable Law.** The Agency shall observe and comply with federal, state and local laws in effect when this Agreement is executed, or which may come into effect during the term of this Agreement, regarding the administration of the Plan. PARS shall observe and comply with federal, state and local laws in effect when this Agreement is executed, or which may come into effect during the term of this Agreement, regarding Plan administrative services provided under this Agreement.

11. **Applicable Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. In the event any party institutes legal proceedings to enforce or interpret this Agreement, venue and jurisdiction shall be in any state court of competent jurisdiction.
12. **Force Majeure.** When a party's nonperformance hereunder was beyond the control and not due to the fault of the party not performing, a party shall be excused from performing its obligations under this Agreement during the time and to the extent that it is prevented from performing by such cause, including but not limited to: any incidence of fire, flood, acts of God, acts of terrorism or war, commandeering of material, products, plants or facilities by the federal, state or local government, or a material act or omission by the other party.
13. **Ownership of Reports and Documents.** The originals of all letters, documents, reports, and data produced for the purposes of this Agreement shall be delivered to, and become the property of the Agency. Copies may be made for PARS but shall not be furnished to others without written authorization from Agency.
14. **Designees.** The Plan Administrator of the Agency, or their designee, shall have the authority to act for and exercise any of the rights of the Agency as set forth in this Agreement, subsequent to and in accordance with the written authority granted by the Governing Body of the Agency, a copy of which writing shall be delivered to PARS. Any officer of PARS, or his or her designees, shall have the authority to act for and exercise any of the rights of PARS as set forth in this Agreement.
15. **Notices.** All notices hereunder and communications regarding the interpretation of the terms of this Agreement, or changes thereto, shall be effected by delivery of the notices in person or by depositing the notices in the U.S. mail, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid and addressed as follows:
 - (A) To PARS: PARS; 4350 Von Karman Avenue, Suite 100, Newport Beach, CA 92660; Attention: President
 - (B) To Agency: Casitas Municipal Water District; 11311 Santa Ana Road, Ventura, CA 93001; Attention: Accounting Manager/TreasurerNotices shall be deemed given on the date received by the addressee.
16. **Term of Agreement.** This Agreement shall remain in effect for the period beginning June 14, 2017 and ending June 13, 2020 ("Term"). This Agreement may be terminated at any time by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party of the intent to terminate. Absent a thirty (30) day written notice to the other party of the intent to terminate, this Agreement will continue unchanged for successive twelve month periods following the Term.
17. **Amendment.** This Agreement may not be amended orally, but only by a written instrument executed by the parties hereto.
18. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement, including exhibits, contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter set forth in this Agreement.

In the event a conflict arises between the parties with respect to any term, condition or provision of this Agreement, the remaining terms, conditions and provisions shall remain in full force and legal effect. No waiver of any term or condition of this Agreement by any party shall be construed by the other as a continuing waiver of such term or condition.

19. **Attorneys Fees.** In the event any action is taken by a party hereto to enforce the terms of this Agreement the prevailing party herein shall be entitled to receive its reasonable attorney's fees.
20. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, and in that event, each counterpart shall be deemed a complete original and be enforceable without reference to any other counterpart.
21. **Headings.** Headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be used to interpret or construe its provisions.
22. **Effective Date.** This Agreement shall be effective on the date first above written, and also shall be the date the Agreement is executed.

EXHIBIT 1A
SERVICES

PARS will provide the following services for the Casitas Municipal Water District Public Agencies Post-Employment Benefits Trust:

1. Plan Installation Services:

- (A) Meeting with appropriate Agency personnel to discuss plan provisions, implementation timelines, actuarial valuation process, funding strategies, benefit communication strategies, data reporting, and submission requirements for contributions/reimbursements/distributions;
- (B) Providing the necessary analysis and advisory services to finalize these elements of the Plan;
- (C) Providing the documentation needed to establish the Plan to be reviewed and approved by Agency legal counsel. Resulting final Plan documentation must be approved by the Agency prior to the commencement of PARS Plan Administration Services outlined in Exhibit 1A, paragraph 2 below.

2. Plan Administration Services:

- (A) Monitoring the receipt of Plan contributions made by the Agency to the trustee of the PARS Public Agencies Post-Employment Benefits Trust (“Trustee”), based upon information received from the Agency and the Trustee;
- (B) Performing periodic accounting of Plan assets, reimbursements/distributions, and investment activity, based upon information received from the Agency and/or Trustee;
- (C) Coordinating the processing of distribution payments pursuant to authorized direction by the Agency, and the provisions of the Plan, and, to the extent possible, based upon Agency-provided Data;
- (D) Coordinating actions with the Trustee as directed by the Plan Administrator within the scope this Agreement;
- (E) Preparing and submitting a monthly report of Plan activity to the Agency, unless directed by the Agency otherwise;
- (F) Preparing and submitting an annual report of Plan activity to the Agency;
- (G) Facilitating actuarial valuation updates and funding modifications for compliance with GASB 45/75, if prefunding OPEB obligations;
- (H) Coordinating periodic audits of the Trust;
- (I) Monitoring Plan and Trust compliance with federal and state laws.

3. PARS is not licensed to provide and does not offer tax, accounting, legal, investment or actuarial advice.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors concur with the General Manager to conduct the Phase 3 of the Horizontal Bore in the Matilija Formation with the consulting team of Water Resource Engineering Associates and Kear Groundwater for the fee of \$208,520.

BACKGROUND:

On November 9th, 2016, the Board of Directors moved to engage the consulting team of Water Resource Engineering Associates and Kear Groundwater to develop the Horizontal Bore in the Matilija Formation Project. The Project appears to have the potential to provide new water resources to the District and will require further investigation. On December 14, 2016, the Board approved the Phase 2 work that included the development of a preliminary design report for the horizontal bore in the Matilija formation. The preliminary design has been developed to a draft status in April, 2017.

During the April meeting of the Water Resources Committee, the consulting team presented observations that were made prior to and after the 2017 winter, and discussed the changed conditions that warrant further investigation to understand the hydrogeology of the Matilija Formation. A Phase 3 proposal has been recommended and submitted to gather information that would provide the understanding of the Formation's hydrogeology.

Under Items 4 and 5 of the Phase 3 proposal, coordination will be conducted with the US Forest Service to put in place stream monitoring stations where water has been observed flowing from the Formation. It is proposed that the monitoring of flows extend for two years, covering two summer periods. At the end of the monitoring, it is proposed to prepare the final hydrogeologic report that would be the basis for CEQA/NEPA documentation and setting of the operational parameters. Tasks 6 through 9 would move the Project through the CEQA/NEPA evaluations that may require an EIR.

In proceeding with the Phase 3 work the construction and implementation of the Project would be set off two to three years into the future. The Phase 3 work appears to be necessary to fully consider the performance and impacts of the Project. With the Formations response to drought and the 2017 winter rainfall, now is the time to gain a full understanding of the Formation's characteristics.

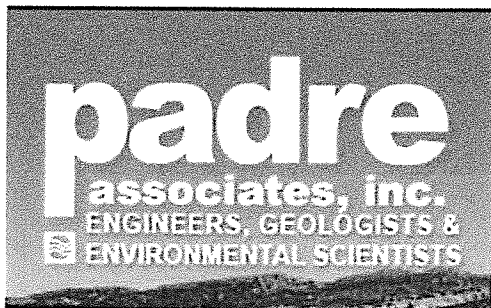

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Directors approve the fees as outlined below, which were reviewed and recommended by the Recreation Committee on June 5, 2017, and schedule a public hearing for the proposed Recreation Area fee structure.

BACKGROUND AND OVERVIEW

The United States constructed the Ventura River Project pursuant to Act of Congress (Public Law 423, 84th Cong., 2d session) approved March 1, 1956 for irrigation, furnishing water for municipal and domestic use and for providing incidental recreation and fish and wildlife benefits as defined by the report submitted to Congress by the Secretary of the Interior entitled, "Ventura River Project, California, Feasibility Report".

Since that time the Casitas Municipal Water District "District" has developed recreation facilities and operations to accommodate the visiting public and has continued to manage the facilities. On October 7, 2011 the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, entered into an updated formal agreement with the District for the Maintenance and Development of Recreation Uses and Facilities at Lake Casitas. That formal recreation management agreement was a spring board for the Bureau of Reclamation "BOR" to support the District's recreation facilities financially and to date the District has received over \$1,268,000 dollars in federal government funding support for infrastructure maintenance and improvements.

The Lake Casitas Recreation Area "LCRA" is part of the District's responsibility, as is providing water, and the District has operated the LCRA on a user fee basis. No water revenue or property tax received by the District from residents should offset costs of the LCRA. Revenue received directly at the gate or from camping covers the costs associated with the operation. It is the intent that the Recreation Area operate with a balanced budget without subsidy from the District.

ANALYSIS

The Recreation Department developed a snowbird program over 10 years ago with the objective to attract customers to the LCRA during the off-season when few customers were using the facilities. The program runs from October 1 through the Sunday before Easter each year. The cost savings along with the opportunity for extended stay attracts visitors to the lake and meets the objective. The last snowbird season brought in over \$53,000 in revenue. The program has very strict protocol that requires a signed

agreement between the customer and the District, a minimum stay of 60 consecutive nights, payment of fees in advance, high standards for vehicle trailer condition and proof of customer and vehicle/trailer identification.

The Recreation Committee reviewed the program fees and recommend the following adjustments:

Camping fees were increased in 2016. The Snowbird Program was not included in those adjustments. The Snowbird Program fees have never been adjusted since inception so it is now recommended that they be adjusted to align with the rising cost of operations.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Casitas will begin operation of the Ojai system on June 8. The Ojai system currently has water meters that require manual reading. This is a labor intensive operation. A more cost effective approach and an approach that Casitas uses for the rest of Casitas' customers, is to use automatic read meters. On May 10, 2017, the Board authorized the purchase of the automatic read meters. This contract will install the meters throughout the Ojai system. The project was advertised through F.W. Dodge and on the District's web site. Four firms submitted proposals. The bid results are as follows:

WHEREAS, Casitas and the management employees have agreed to terms and conditions of employment; and

WHEREAS, the term of this agreement shall be for three years; and

WHEREAS, the salaries for the management employees will be increased by the April to April CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers for Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County, CA with a base of 0% and a maximum of 4% effective July 1, 2017 and each subsequent July 1 during the term of the agreement; and

WHEREAS, Effective July 1, 2017 Salaries will be increased by 7% reflecting the retirement offset; and

WHEREAS, Effective on the first day of the pay period on or after July 1, 2017, "classic" CalPERS members shall pay 7% of pensionable compensation towards the required employee contribution to Ca1PERS. The employee contribution, as determined by CalPERS is presently set at seven percent (7%) of pensionable compensation. Employees shall pay their share of the employee contribution by pre-tax payroll deduction pursuant to Section 414(h)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

WHEREAS, payment for Jury duty will be capped at ten days; and

WHEREAS, the cap on life insurance will be increased to \$300,000; and

WHEREAS, the district will provide a match on the deferred compensation plans of fifty percent of each dollar contributed to a maximum of 1 % employer match for 2% employee contribution.

WHEREAS, dependent vision coverage will be provided; and

WHEREAS, a cell phone reimbursement of \$35 per month may be provided to managers who utilize their personal cell phones in lieu of a district provided phone.

WHEREAS, all other terms and conditions of employment for the management unit will be the same.

Re: Letter to United Water Conservation District – Water Releases from Lake Piru

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors consider the attached letter for delivery to the United Water Conservation District.

BACKGROUND:

On June 2nd, 2017, the United Water Conservation District conducted a special meeting of the Board of Directors at the base of Santa Felicia Dam. Director Baggerly and I attended the meeting after a special invitation was extended to me. The key topic for the special meeting was the increased release (420 cubic feet per second) of water from Santa Felicia Dam. During the presentation we heard:

- 1) There is a water quality emergency in the El Rio groundwater, high nitrates, that could be resolved by brining water into the groundwater basin;
- 2) United WCD has concluded from its sampling and testing of water released from Santa Felicia Dam, that quagga mussel veligers do not survive the release action and therefore are not migrating into the Lower Piru Creek and the Santa Clara River;
- 3) The United plan is release 15,000 acre-feet of water from Lake Piru, coupled with 10,000 acre-feet of Article 21 water and additional storm flow releases from Lake Castaic, would resolve the water quality emergency in El Rio.

The Casitas Quagga Ad Hoc Committee met on June 7th to discuss the observation of the special meeting and the creation of the attached letter for consideration of delivering to the United WCD.

Subject: Release of Quagga Mussel Infested Water from Lake Piru Downstream to the Santa Clara River

Dear President Dandy and Members of the UWCD Board of Directors:

Casitas Municipal Water District (CMWD) wishes to thank the United Water Conservation District (UWCD) for extending an invitation to attend a Special Meeting held June 2 at the Santa Felicia Dam to review current water releases from Lake Piru through the dam.

CMWD has a very high level of interest and concern in the Quagga Mussel infestation at Lake Piru (impounded by Santa Felicia Dam) since UWCD first reported to CMWD in December, 2013 that this invasive species was discovered in the lake. The basis of our concern has always been that releases of Quagga Mussels from the dam (and their subsequent movement downstream to the Santa Clara River estuary) could eventually lead to the infestation of the Ventura River Watershed and, ultimately, Lake Casitas as a result of transmission by birds, fishermen and transient populations. This major concern was the impetus for initiating an extensive letter writing campaign by CMWD to several governmental agencies (including the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and State of California Departments of Water Resources and Fish and Wildlife). In summary, these letters requested help in finding ways to curtail infested water releases and discover eradication methods that would be 100% effective for Quagga Mussels. Almost two years ago, it was reported in the *Ventura County Star* that effective biocides were available; however, UWCD decided **not** to use them (*Quagga Mussels Are Likely There to Stay*, *Ventura County Star*, Aug.18, 2015).

Now that significant amounts of potentially infested water are being released by UWCD (at a reported rate of 420 cubic feet per second) the potential for the Santa Clara River becoming infested with Quagga Mussels is increasing dramatically. During the meeting of June 2, UWCD staff categorized the water releases as an emergency because of the need to maintain drinking water standards for downstream well water users.

Also, during the meeting on June 2, your General Manager (Mr. Guardado) stated that UWCD had the authority to make the water releases since an emergency existed. In contrast, it is our understanding UWCD's current releases of infested water are not consistent with the provisions of Fish and Game Code Section 2301(a)(1) which prohibits the planting, transporting, or placement of Quagga Mussels in any waters of the State unless authorization had been previously obtained from the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW). Please inform CMWD whether or not such authorization had been obtained from CDFW and, also, state the Code section Mr. Guardado was actually referencing which would provide statutory justification for taking emergency action to release potentially infested water. Mr. Guardado also stated that UWCD has not discovered any Quagga Mussels further downstream and this lead the District to

believe that the velocity of the releases has killed the adult mussels and larvae. If this is to be believed, UWCD should publish data to substantiate its claim and, also, forward it to CMWD. CMWD is aware that Quagga Mussels have been found in Lower Piru Creek as a result of required 7 cfs flow released per FERC requirements. Please see Ventura County Star new story *Quaggas Make It to Piru Creek*, published January 31, 2014.

We anticipate UCWD will continue its efforts to find and use effective eradication techniques that will kill Quagga Mussels in all of their life stages in Lake Piru before continuing the release of water from Santa Felecia Dam. It is also essential that a plan must be implemented for comprehensive monitoring and laboratory testing of water samples from the Santa Clara River to determine if Quagga Mussel colonies have or have not become established. The laboratory findings should be posted on UWCD's website in a conspicuous place so that potentially impacted parties such as farmers and the cities of Fillmore, Santa Paula, Oxnard, Ventura and Ojai can access the data. This would allow affected parties to be made quickly aware of any existing and/or future Quagga Mussel infestations.

Finally, we wish to underscore the issue of potential infestation in any other waters of Ventura County, including Lake Casitas, by Quagga Mussels because our reservoir is primarily designated for drinking water purposes as well as for agricultural and commercial beneficial uses. Clearly, an infestation of Quagga Mussels could cause significant increases in the cost of operations, along with the cost of maintenance and distribution of water for our customers.

Please keep in mind that UWCD has an inherent obligation as a public corporation to accept responsibility for their actions related to releasing infested water from Santa Felicia Dam and to report all of their actions to legal jurisdictions in both the Santa Clara and Ventura River watersheds. Also, UWCD has a obligation to provide data supporting their claims that velocity and turbulence can eliminate Quagga Mussels in all their life stages during the release of water from Santa Felecia Dam.

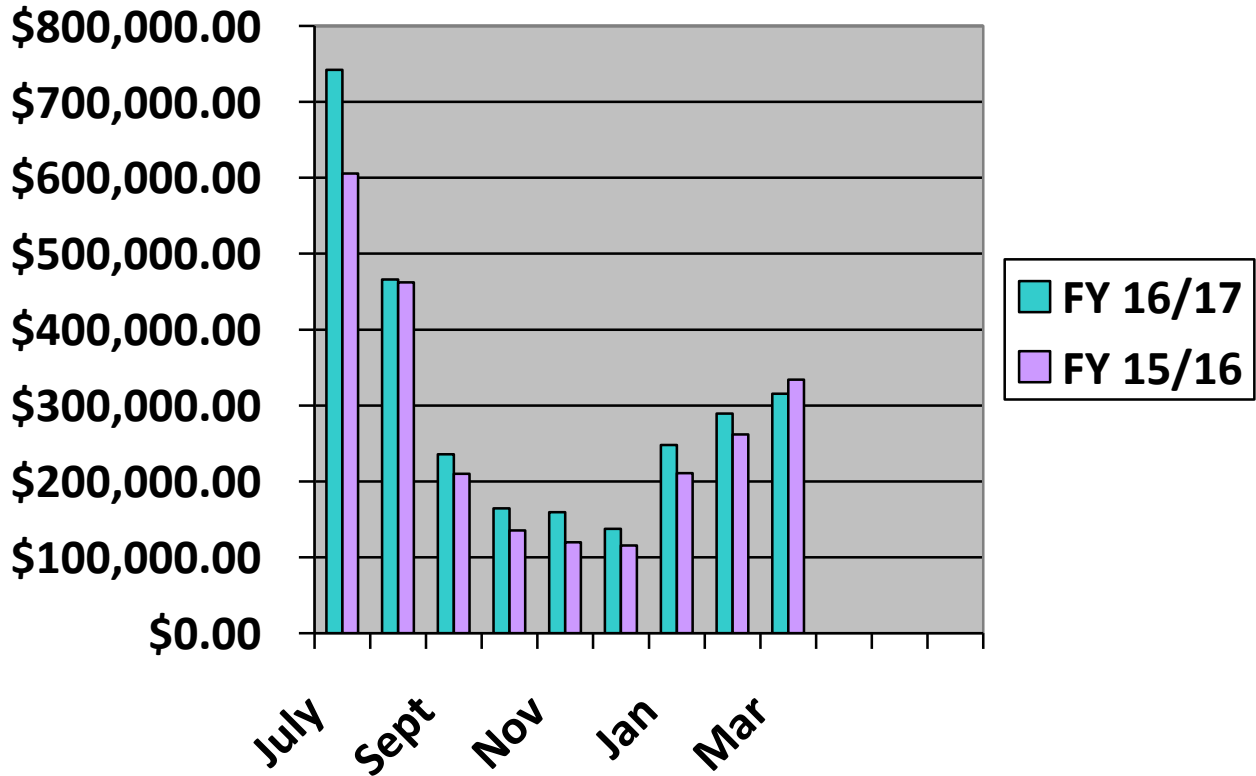
There were five cables sold for new inspections, two vessels were re-inspected and a total of 825 vessels were retagged in April. Five vessels failed the first inspection in April 2017. Santa Ana Launch Ramp was put back into operation after the water level rose and Old Coyote could no longer be reached by road.

Incidents

There were 69 calls for service from the public and 122 staff observations of violations where the park staff made customer contact. Incidents included a fatal traffic collision, three outside service responses for medicals, five boating violations, four parking violations and thirteen leash law violations. Outside services responded to one burglary and one operation of a vehicle while under the influence.
