

The Everglades Foundation Internship Program



The Everglades Foundation internships are available in a range of topics related to Everglades restoration. Interns interested in Everglades restoration will have the opportunity to work side-by-side with an experienced scientist, engineer, or planner on a variety of topics, including field investigations in hydrology and biology in the Everglades, scientific/technical analyses related the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan, and policy and advocacy of Everglades restoration.

ELIGIBILITY

Undergraduate juniors or seniors, recent graduates, and graduate students are eligible for Internship Program. The internship is open to students or recent graduates in the natural sciences, biological sciences, engineering, geography, planning, resources management, law, economics, and the social sciences. We are especially interested in students pursuing cross-disciplinary studies.

POSITIONS

The internships are for full-time employment in the summer of 2008, and can include one semester of part-time work. The summer will be spent at the Everglades Foundation offices, although the part-time component could be at the intern's university. Salaries range from \$12 to \$20 per hour, depending upon education and experience.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

All students who wish to be considered for the Everglades Foundation Internship should submit a cover letter, resume, list of course work, letters of recommendations, and a brief Statement of Interests. The Statement of Interests should include your professional interest, your personal interest in Everglades restoration, and your unique skills and abilities. 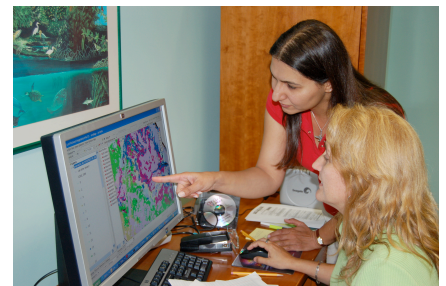
