Minutes of the Casitas Municipal Water District Board Meeting Held September 23, 2015

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held September 23, 2015 at the District office in Oak View, California. The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. Directors Bergen, Kaiser, Baggerly, Word and Hicks were present. Also present were Steve Wickstrum, General Manager, Rebekah Vieira, Clerk of the Board, and Attorney, John Mathews. There were nine staff members and two members of the public in attendance. President Bergen led the group in the flag salute.

1. <u>Public Comments</u> (items not on the agenda – three minute limit).

Mohammed Hasan spoke about the drought crisis that is brewing in California and Ventura County. He informed the Board about his new book Drought is Not a Four-Letter Word and explained that if we do not come up with sustainable solutions we face dire consequences year after year, higher food prices, and less revenue for Casitas. He added that conservation is important as well as innovation stating that not innovating is a disaster waiting to happen. His book is available on Amazon.

William Slade House, resident of Ventura provided a timeline of his objection to being evicted from the lake for six months. He stated the Park Services Officers don't have authority to revoke my privileges. He added that the Martinelli study does not give enforcement authority and he has been given no due process and was not told what rule he broke. He went on to say that Steve has been great in this process and added that he was cited in May for trespassing and fishing without a license. He snuck in at Willow Creek and was convicted of interfering with a federal officer. He asked to be treated fairly and given due process. He again stated they don't have the right to evict me and they don't like me. He added that he would be working with his lawyer as this is a breach of contract and unlawful detainer and he will be going to court if this does not get resolved. He added that I want to be allowed back in the lake and I will be out of your hair. Director Baggerly addressed the Board and suggested that since we had been threatened by a lawsuit, no one should be speaking with him and he can talk to our attorney.

2. General Manager comments.

Mr. Wickstrum informed the board of the passing of Bob Music, a retiree of the District. Bob did a lot to set this district up in the right direction installing the distribution systems we have today. He did them with Irish Construction and then from 1959 – 1980 he was involved in all pipe that went in the ground during that period and then he became the O & M Superintendent. Bob was very interested in this district. During rain storms and he would be out there checking the canal. He was a respected individual. Director Baggerly suggested that we adjourn the meeting in his memory.

Mr. Wickstrum informed the board that memorial services for Jim Coultas are on Sunday at 2:00 pm at coyote ramp.

Mr. Wickstrum then passed around a photo from 1967 and explained that is almost exactly where we stand today. He then shared that Lake Cachuma was at 17% of supply. They may make it until Oct. 2016, when the desal gets operational.

Water quality is improving as we are putting a lot of oxygen in the lake. He added that we finally had delivery of the stainless steel ammonia tanks and we took delivery of the new distribution truck which Brian Taylor is getting it outfitted.

3. <u>Board of Director comments.</u>

Director Hicks commented on Metropolitan going to toilet to tap.

Director Baggerly suggested that since we are trending down to about half of the amount of water down to 40%, we should look proactively at educating the public as we come to the next level and stage for Lake Casitas.

Director Kaiser questioned if there were updates on a couple of fires that had been in the area. Mr. Wickstrum explained that there were no reports of cause.

4. <u>Board of Director Verbal Reports on Meetings Attended.</u>

Director Hicks reported on his attendance at the AWA event at the Reagan Library. It was an interesting talk and he learned that our biggest opportunity is to take up the species that suck up the water such as the arrundo,

Director Baggerly reported on his attendance at the Matilija Design Oversight Group. The meeting was almost a year from the last meeting. They were waiting for the technical committee review on the concepts that were developed for new scenarios for dam removal process. Option 1, Install a large coffer dam above the reservoir, drilling a tunnel through the mountain to put fresh water into the north fork of Matilija Creek. They would anticipate removal of the dam and flushing of sediments in a single season. Option 2 has two components: Drilling or boring of 12 foot tunnels at base of dam thru to the end and placing charges. When there is a storm anticipated they would blow out the back side of the tunnel and allow the storm to flush out the fine sediment. If there is not enough to clear it out then they would put gates over the upstream holes that were drilled to control the release of sediments so they don't get into Lake Casitas. Then, they would blast the dam, remove and recycle the concrete. This is probably the best idea they came up with. Option 3 is temporary upstream storage of fine sediments, this option is not liked. These reports need to be finalized and comments sent within 30 days of the meeting. Casitas should support 2 a and b and add in comments as needed. The General Manager received direction from the board on sending a letter.

Mr. Wickstrum explained that we can discuss this with Water Resources and perhaps at the first meeting in October. Mr. Wickstrum suggested the Board review the Matilija Dam website, matilijadam.org.

Director Kaiser added it is best to have full review, independent in nature as he is concerned for water quality and reduction in water diversions. We need to get a good idea on how it will affect the district. Director Word asked about the time frame and funding. Mr. Wickstrum explained they are trying to move the project along but the funding from Congress was approved using an option that may not be the one that is being considered now. Director Kaiser asked if the graduated notching off the table. Mr. Wickstrum replied it is off. Director Kaiser said that with graduated notching you can measure it better in a lot of ways. Mr. Wickstrum replied that was on the table for over a year. It may take 20 years and may not; there was a lot of downside to that item and downside to the water supply. We may have to duck diversions for 20 years. Perhaps it is better to pull the band aid off quick and get it done. Condit dam has been successfully performed. There are risks and unknowns with every project. Director Baggerly added it is uncontrolled, using force of nature to move water from point a to point b, the ocean.

VARIOUS LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT

DATE: OCTOBER 6, 2015

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to sign a Purchase Order Contract with the lowest responsible and responsive bidder for the Asphalt Patch at various District locations with MERRIMAN PAVING & EXCAVATING in the amount of \$26,892.00. It is further recommended that the President of the Board authorize staff to proceed with the administration of the contract.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Repairs to water services require digging, causing damage to asphalt roadways. Casitas crews cover the damaged area with a temporary patch. When enough patches have been accumulated, bids are solicited for permanent asphalt to be installed. On this project there were 21 patches that will receive **6**, **4** & **3-inch** asphalt overlay after sub-grade compaction. One location will receive slurry-backfill per the County Inspector's request. The project was advertised on the District's website and with F.W. Dodge.

Out of the four (4) local firms that were sent invitations to participate, two (2) firms submitted bids.

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Merriman Paving & Excavating has a Contractor's license in good standing and has satisfactorily performed work for the District in Upper Ojai, Oak View, and Meiners Oaks in the past. Merriman Paving & Excavating is currently registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. The Engineer's estimate was a total of \$25,000.00.

BUDGET

Funding for this project is included the FY 2015-16 Budget. Casitas has budgeted \$55,000.00 for road repairs in FY 2015-16. Typically, at least two patching projects are bid per fiscal year. This is the first patch project for FY 2015-16. This project is within budget.

POLE AT THE VILLANOVA RESERVOIR SITE

DATE: OCTOBER 6, 2015

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors direct staff to forward, without opposition, the Southern California Gas request for a license to install and operate a telemetry pole at the Villanova Reservoir site to the United States Bureau of Reclamation.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Southern California Gas is in the process of installing meters that can be read remotely. The data is sent from the meter to a relay pole where it is then forwarded to a central office. Southern California Gas has identified the entrance area to the Villanova Reservoir as a good location for the relay pole. The data can be used for improved leak detection and for better monitoring of usage by customers. The system reduces the costs for meter reading and Southern California Gas provides access to the network for Water agencies interested in automated meter reading.

Pictures of a typical relay pole are attached. The pole will be located just outside of the gate to the Villanova Reservoir but still on United States Bureau of Reclamation property. The pole will not interfere with Casitas' operations of the Villanova Reservoir or pipelines.

Casitas and United States Bureau of Reclamation do not own the access road to Villanova Reservoir but only have an access easement. This access easement does not provide for access that is not related to the operation and maintenance of water facilities. Casitas has informed Southern California Gas that Southern California Gas will have to acquire their own access easement to the Villanova Reservoir from the property owners. Southern California Gas has contacted those owners to enter an agreement to access the private road.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Directors approve the fees and charges as outlined below.

BACKGROUND

The United States constructed the Ventura River Project pursuant to Act of Congress (Public Law 423, 84th Cong., 2d session) approved March 1, 1956 for irrigation, furnishing water for municipal and domestic use and for providing incidental recreation and fish and wildlife benefits as defined by the report submitted to Congress by the Secretary of the Interior entitled, "Ventura River Project, California, Feasibility Report".

Since that time the Casitas Municipal Water District "District" has developed recreation facilities and operations to accommodate the visiting public and has continued to manage the facilities. On October 7, 2011 the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, entered into an updated formal agreement with the District for the Maintenance and Development of Recreation Uses and Facilities at Lake Casitas. That formal recreation management agreement was a spring board for the Bureau of Reclamation "BOR" to support the District's recreation facilities financially and to date the District has received over one million dollars in federal government funding support for infrastructure maintenance and improvements.

The Lake Casitas Recreation Area "LCRA" is part of the District's responsibility, as is providing water, and the District has operated the LCRA on a user fee basis. Revenue received directly covers the costs associated with the operation. It is the intent that the Recreation Area operate with a balanced budget without subsidy from the District.

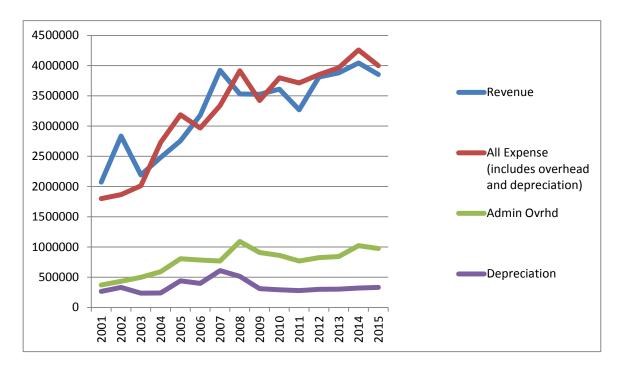
ANALYSIS

At a glance, direct costs and direct revenue dollars balance, but the LCRA also relies on administrative services provided by District staff such as the finance department, payroll, human resources, General Manager and the Board. The formula used for the District to recoup these costs is based on the total number of full-time and part-time staff and the percentage they represent for both the "Recreation" and "Water" side. This formula fluctuates annually and the dollar amount is represented as the administrative overhead % in the budget. This representing percent changes with the actual number of total District full-time and part-time employees in any particular fiscal year.

Staff costs are the single highest cost of LCRA operations, second is the administrative overhead applied as a cost from the aforementioned formula. As employee benefit costs and the need for additional staff increase, those two budget items also increase. In addition, full-time employee wages are increasing in sync with the cost of living and part-time with changes in the minimum wage. It is apparent, since staff costs increase and administrative overhead increases, that identified user fees should also adjust.

A fee comparison study was conducted in 2014 and 2015 between similar agencies in the state and although all agencies vary in services, location and amenities, the recommended increases are selected in an attempt to stay within the market value (2015 results is shown on pages 7-10) without overpricing the Recreation Area causing customers to visit elsewhere. The last time camping and the other proposed user fees were adjusted was in 2008. Following that adjustment, in the same year, the threat of quagga infestation resulted in a strict tagging protocol for boaters and boating related fees were raised in 2011 to offset the increased cost of additional staffing.

The graph below indicates the trend for total recreation revenue and total recreation expenses and illustrates cost trends associated with the applied administrative overhead formula and depreciation.



Based on the trend, it is credible that a change in either expense or revenue in the opposite direction is needed. Changing or decreasing costs is not recommended since the Recreation Area has been able to address deferred maintenance costs with matching BOR funds and staff costs are the single highest expense and, if anything, additional staff are needed for a smooth operation and to protect the lake especially from invasive species. The Park Services Officer force comes at a high cost, however investing in a strong team to protect the LCRA, the customers and the lake is a wise investment since we know that post infection costs are

exponential and, at best, eradiation measures estimates currently available are in the millions of dollars.

Raising revenue is recommended and is the compatible option. The fee schedule recommendation was discussed and approved by the Recreation Committee on October 6, 2014 and September 3, 2015 with most quarter dollar amounts now rounded to the nearest half dollar. The spreadsheet below on page 6 shows the anticipated revenue that will be received if changes are implemented. If approved, the new fees will go into effect November 1, 2015. Trailer storage fees will become effective January 1, 2016 in order to give customers adequate notice of the increase. The increase will be reflected on the December 2015 invoice since fees are paid one month in advance.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors direct staff to purchase and install sound panels to the lower section of the existing motor girdle frames, Alternate 3.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

At the July 22, 2015 Board meeting, the Board directed staff to review options provided by Acoustiblok, Inc. as requested by three neighboring properties. The Board also directed staff to return with other options that may reduce or mitigate the high pitch sound from the 4M Pump Plant.

High frequency sound is marked by short wave lengths that are generally easier to mitigate than longer deeper sound waves. Sound is also largely line of sight. The topography in the area is generally rising to the north, east and south and falling to the west. At least two of the homes owners complaining about the high frequency noise are located significantly above the pumps. Acoustiblok, Inc. has provided two options to reduce the high frequency sound from the pump plant:

- 1. Remove the existing motor girdles and install 12 foot high sound panels surrounding the pumps. Proposal is based on a four sided 42 foot by 16 foot perimeter. Proposal does not include the structural support, design, painting or installation. (Alternate 1)
- 2. Remove the existing motor girdles and install 10 foot tall sound panels two feet off the ground, surrounding the pumps. The proposal is based on a 22 foot by 4 foot perimeter. The proposal does not include structural support, design, painting or installation. (Alternate 2)

Acoustiblok does not guarantee or warrant the effectiveness of their proposed alternative. The largest risk is that the panels are not high enough to block and adsorb the sound waves. An additional risk for Alternate 2 is that the sound could be reflected from the ground under the panels. The risk of the sound going over the top of panels in Alternate 2 is less than in Alternate 1 as the panels are significantly closer to the noise source, the pump motors.

A third option, not proposed by Acoustiblok, is to cover the lower eighteen inches of the motor girdle support frame with either Acoustiblok fence material or exterior sound panels as manufactured by Acoustical Solutions. (Alternate 3) A hand held sound meter was used to determine that the bulk of the sound was emanating from the area below the bottom of the motor girdle. An 18" sound blanket was hung from the bottom of the support frame reduced the sound level significantly.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors:

- Authorize the General Manager to issue a Purchase Order Contract with Padre Associates Inc. for the not-to-exceed amount of \$2140 to complete pre construction biological surveys.
- 2. Adopt the resolution accepting the proposal submitted by the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and award the contract for the construction of the Lake Casitas Shoreline Vegetation Removal, Specification 15-381 to Civic Construction Associates in the amount of \$199,000. It is further recommended that the President of the Board execute the agreement for said work and the Board authorize staff to proceed with the administration of the contract.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Large areas of shoreline at Lake Casitas have become exposed as the lake level has fallen and significant vegetation has grown. The vegetation, once the lake level rises again, add to the organic loading in the lake. Organics contribute to the formation of algae. Algae contribute to taste and odor issues and can reduce the dissolved oxygen level in the lower levels of the lake. This project will remove much of the vegetation from the Santa Ana Creek (Area A on the attached map) and about one half of the north side of Wadliegh Arm area (Area B).

The pre-construction biological surveys are a mitigation measure contained in the Mitigated Negative Declaration for this project. It was originally conceived that the surveys would be conducted by a part time Casitas employee. However, this person's teaching work load will not permit her to complete this work. Padre Associates Inc. has people available to conduct the surveys and has successfully completed similar work for Casitas in the past.

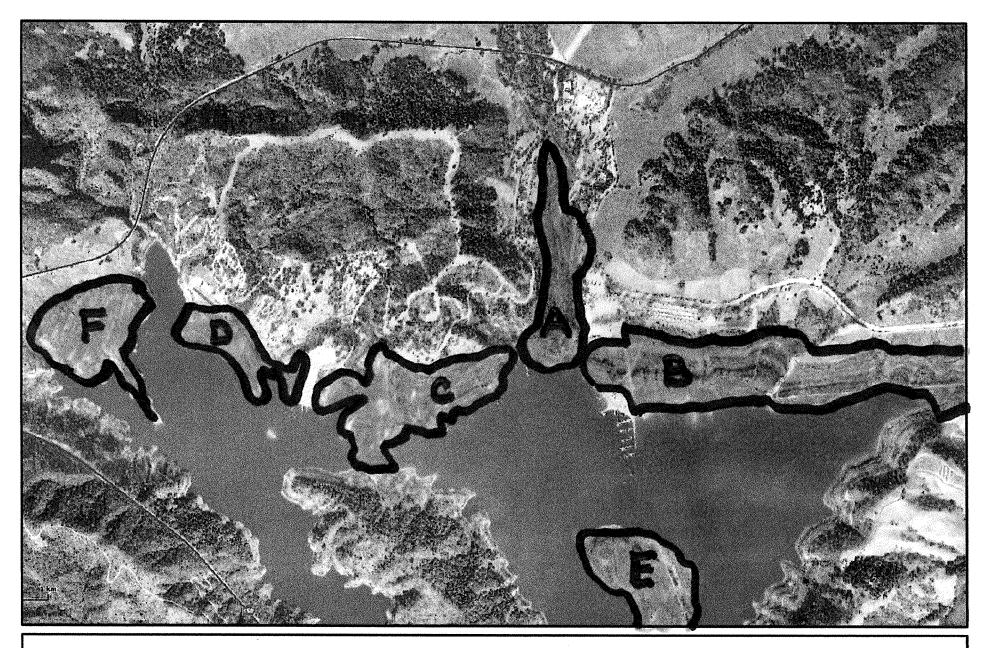
The project was advertised through F.W. Dodge and on the District's web site. Four firms submitted proposals. The bid results are:

Civic Construction Associates is a relatively new firm with little work history. Casitas has reviewed their financial statements. The firm appears to have adequate resources to complete this project. Civic Construction Associates is registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. Civic Construction Associates has a current Contractor's license.

Casitas has received notice that the project falls under the Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit Program. Permit/Certification applications with fees were submitted to both the California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFG) and the Regional Water Quality Board. The State time limit for both to respond to the applications has expired. CDFG previously submitted comments during the CEQA review period. These comments were included in the CEQA document and the contract specifications.

The Contractor will be paid on a per acre completed basis. The \$199,000 award amount is based on completing 35 acres in Area A and 47 acres in Area B. No work will be completed by the Contractor in Areas C, D, E and F. The Fiscal Year 2015-16 Budget includes \$250,000 for this work. The remaining funds will be used for vegetation removal in smaller selected areas by fire crews and the California Conservation Corps.

3. **Board/Manager comments.**

The General Manager informed the Committee of the following events:

- a) October 17th Ojai Day, interest by directors in attending the booth;
- b) November 4th Association of Water Agencies, Ventura County Water Bus Tour includes Casitas Dam visit at 2:00 PM.
- c) Invitation to General Manager to attend governor's Drought taskforce meeting on October 14th in Santa Paula – invitation received on October 8th – limited to invitee. The General Manager will attend and report.

Director Kaiser commented to the Committee that there is an El Nino meeting scheduled for October 15th, 6 PM to 8PM, at the Oak view Community Center. The presentations are by the County of Ventura Office of Emergency Services (OES). Attendance is advised.

4. <u>Discussion regarding the letter sent to State Water Control Board from a consortium of water agencies.</u>

The Committee discussed the content of the letter and agreed with the direction and concerns of the letter. The letter is to be provided in the Board's agenda as information.

5. <u>Discussion regarding proposals for Boardroom audio system.</u>

Staff has obtained prices for an audio system that range in price from approximately \$11,000 to \$32,000. The Committee suggested that we continue to use the current system or acquire a similar system for less than \$2,000 and plan for the new system with building improvements that are budgeted for this year.

6. <u>Discussion regarding a Memorandum of Understanding for use of Flexible Storage</u> <u>Account.</u>

This Committee discussed the background and benefits of the flexible storage at Castaic Lake, the association with the State Water Project, and the proposed amendment to the current MOU that is set to expire on December 1, 2015. The Castaic Lake Water Agency, United Water Conservation District, and Ventura Water are also considering the participation in the amendment of the MOU. This item will be brought forward to the Board at a future date.

7. <u>Discussion regarding scheduling of Board meetings in November and December.</u>
The Committee considered changes to the regularly scheduled Board meetings for the dates of November 11th and 25th, and December 23rd. The initial suggestions are to move the November 11th meeting to November 12th, and consider each of the other two meetings based on the availability of a Board quorum and agenda item priority.

8. <u>Discussion regarding additional staffing considerations in the Executive Section</u> of the District.

The Committee was informed that work continues to develop job descriptions for the Assistant General Manager and Human Resources positions. The job descriptions should be completed by the end of October.

9. <u>Discussion regarding potential issues of concern for Executive Committee</u> <u>awareness such as upcoming policy, inter-agency matters, etc.</u>

The General Manager informed the Committee of the following:

- a) Ron Merckling has been directed to update the Legislative Policy, completion prior to January 1, 2016.
- b) The General Manager is continuing to work on revisions to the Rates and Regulations for Water Service.
- c) Carol Belser and Suzi Taylor are developing the information requested by the Board regarding Park Services Officer policies, procedures, job descriptions, and have a goal to bring this information forward before January 1, 2015.
- d) The General Manager and O&M Manager have met with management of the Ojai Valley Land Conservancy to develop cooperation and communication that will be needed during the future El Nino rain storms. The topics discussed included restricting public access during major storm flow events and water diversion by Casitas, communication upon entry on the canal road, protection of property and lessen public risk to natural events in our common areas, contact with Ojai Valley News for a collaborative and informative news article on issues of the public interaction with a flowing Ventura River. The General Manager will contact the Ojai Valley News.

Dear Chair Marcus and Members of the State Water Resources Control Board,

We, the undersigned workshop participants, wish to thank you for your ongoing leadership in effectively guiding California through this period of severe drought. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) rapidly developed emergency drought conservation regulations that were implemented within a very condensed period of time. Several unresolved issues related to the emergency conservation regulations were understood to be too complex to fully consider in the short timeframe available to the State Water Board and its stakeholders. To address these issues, the State Water Board committed to conduct a subsequent workshop to respond to these "parking lot" issues and potentially modify the emergency conservation regulations once resolutions of these issues could be established.

We very much appreciate the invitation extended to us by State Water Board staff to meet on August 26, 2015 to discuss ongoing conservation regulations, which also included an interest from State Water Board staff to discuss the conceptual mechanics for implementing long-term water conservation regulations that would exist beyond the declaration of a drought emergency. The interpreted authority for being able to extend conservation regulations beyond the drought emergency was presented to us in a summary handout from State Water Board staff.

The need for the establishment of permanent conservation regulations during non-drought periods is a topic of enormous public policy importance, with great potential for unintended consequences. The process should not be rushed, nor adequate public input bypassed. At the meeting on August 26th, staff stated the State Water Board has sufficient authority to promulgate and enforce statewide water conservation standards during non-emergency periods as soon as 2016 and intended to do so by simple declaration of this authority.

We disagree with this interpretation of authority and feel strongly that more time must be spent publicly deliberating this assumption of need. Also, we respectfully suggest that any conversation regarding the need for permanent water conservation regulations be balanced within an integrated planning framework that simultaneously evaluates the availability of water supplies. This is a very complex topic deserving of a full articulation of regional needs before presuming a state mandate for intervention.

We ask the State Water Board to be very clear in considering long-term objectives for water management in California. We recommend that the end goal should be water supply reliability and drought resiliency, not water conservation as an end in itself. In the drought regulations that were adopted by the State Water Board, a narrow definition of sufficient water supplies was considered. Regions with sufficient water supplies were allowed a minimal 4% conservation standard. The justification for this allowance was that drought resilient regions should not be subject to unreasonable conservation standards for the sole purpose of reducing water use or establishing a "fairness in suffering" standard. This principle should be expanded beyond a narrow definition of sufficient water supply and agencies should be encouraged to make significant investments in developing and managing water supplies to minimize drought impacts. Further, this approach embraces the comprehensive nature of the California Water Action Plan.

Additionally, we believe that much good work has been already accomplished by local water providers and the Department of Water Resources (DWR) within the 20x2020 framework, which has not yet been fully tested as a viable approach for encouraging water use efficiency during periods of non-drought. Many agencies have been working towards meeting conservation targets even before the drought. The results of that effort helped improve supply reliability going into the drought and should be evaluated before any additional regulations are considered.

There are also on-going conservation efforts that need the time to fully develop. For example, DWR recently completed a Commercial, Industrial and Institutional (CII) Task Force Best Management Practices Report that took four years of intensive work with stakeholders to develop. We believe it is reasonable to allow recently developed conservation approaches such as this to be given a chance to be implemented and reviewed for efficacy during a non-drought period before considering a transition into a new regulatory framework.

Finally, we think the State Water Board and stakeholders must take the necessary time to consider the impact of the emergency conservation regulations before discussing long-term standards. While the emergency regulations have clearly resulted in reduced urban water use, a number of questions remain including:

- What benefit was derived from the water saved? Is it stored for ongoing drought conditions? Did it help the environment or other water users?
- What is the true cost to local agencies of complying with the emergency regulations, and is the apportionment of cost and benefit equitable?
- What are the short and long term impacts on local agency revenues and financial stability?
- What impacts, if any, has the drought response had on California's citizens, businesses and economy?
- Can and should the response of California's citizens to the drought emergency be expected to continue during more normal hydrologic conditions?

It is our understanding that another workshop will be scheduled by the State Water Board to occur in October at which time the parking lot issues related to the current drought ordinance will be discussed and possibly decided. We very much look forward to participating in that effort. We believe it is wise to bifurcate decisions related to emergency drought regulations and long-term water conservation standards, as the two should not be assumed to be the same.

We remain your committed partners in developing thoughtful, meaningful policy options for assuring water resilient communities in California. We are available and ready to assist the State Water Board with further refinement of the emergency regulations. Thank you for this opportunity to express our thoughts related to the August 26 meeting.
