



equestrians every day, an opportunity that they otherwise might not have."

As Youth Ambassador, Sing hopes to focus on education, volunteerism, and team bonding. She sees an opportunity for the Junior Committee to help the general public better understand what shows are about-the work, special connection between horse and rider, and the exciting sport, by creating informative and fun videos for social media, as well as Instagram stories to expand social media collaboration with equestrians, barns, and horse shows. WIHS Military Night also holds special meaning for Sing as both her parents served in the Air Force, and that evening recognizes their service as well as military organizations like Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS).

Working alongside WIHS staff, Junior Committee members participate in monthly show planning and brainstorming meetings, which this year largely will take place virtually rather than in person due to the impact of COVID-19.

In the coming weeks, expects to see a greater presence of committee members on WIHS social media with the newly created Junior Committee Instagram account, which will debut soon.

MORE ABOUT THE WIHS JUNIOR COMMITTEE

This year the WIHS Junior Committee & Youth Ambassador Program will celebrate its 11th year. This innovative program offers an opportunity for Washington-area teens to be a part of the inner workings of the Washington International Horse Show.

Through an application process, approximately 30 teens from public, charter and private schools in Maryland, Virginia and Washington, DC, are selected to join the junior committee.

During the summer and fall, working with WIHS staff, they develop ideas from the youth perspective for the show, learn new skills, and are involved in equine-related volunteer activities, including American Horse Council's Meet A Horse Day, and helping at therapeutic riding centers such as Northern Virginia Therapeutic Riding Center and Sprout.

During show week, committee members are involved with autograph signings, as tour guides and press escorts, in social media takeovers,

assisting with WIHS Kids' Day and Breakfast with the Mounted Police community events and other operational activities.

The WIHS Youth Ambassador holds a leadership role as chair of the Junior Committee and represents the show's youth perspective to the media. Those wishing to be considered for the 2020 WIHS Youth Ambassador will complete an additional application to showcase strengths in leadership and management.

- 2021 Application(s) are available in May! Applications are due April 6, 2021. Those wishing to apply for the position as Youth Ambassador must complete a second application included in application packet.
- Applicants must be students between the ages of 14 and 18 enrolled at local Washington, DC, Virginia or Maryland-area schools.








TRADITION CONTINUES

When I was deep in the throes of graduate school at American University during the late 1960s, I needed a break and found

the perfect nearby destination--the Washington International Horse Show, held in those days at the D.C. Armory east of the Capitol. It was an intimate setting offering classes for a variety of breeds, including Appaloosas and Saddlebreds, but what I remember most was being thrilled to witness show jumper Rodney Jenkins (a future WIHS hall of Famer) in action.

I didn't go to the show again until 2002, when the ASPCA Maclay came to Washington the year after that championship's parent, the National Horse Show, was last held in Madison Square Garden.

I was there to cover the action for EquiSearch and found myself totally wowed by a show in the heart of a major American city, just few blocks from the White House. Museums, restaurants and hotels were even closer, as metropolitan life swirled busily around me.

As I wrote at the time, I'd never before been to the MCI Center (later the Verizon Center and then the Capital One Center), but "when I walked into the arena for the WIHS, it felt like home. There's something about holding an equestrian competition in a big, all-purpose facility like this that heightens the excitement."

I experienced that same excitement every time I returned for the next 17 years. The anticipation started to build as soon as I came out of the Metro subway system and was face-to-face with the onstreet stabling. Seeing the horses walking placidly up and down the sidewalk as if they were on their trails at home had to be a kick, and watching them cleverly avoid the pillars in the show's tiny warm-up area was impressive.

But it was what happened in the arena that really impressed me. WIHS kept its puissance going while other shows had abandoned this crowd-pleasing class. We all held our breath hoping the blocks at the top of the big wall wouldn't topple for the valiant horse and rider combinations that soared higher than anyone else in the country would be jumping that year.

Of course, the show's highlight always is the President's Cup, one of the few trophies that still generates instant recognition. What a privilege to be documenting the efforts of such great horses as the immortal Sapphire, who won the class in both 2008 and 2010.

McLain Ward, the mare's rider, said after her 2010 win, "I think it is great to be here in the city. I hope we can stay for many years".

We have all looked forward to that class annually, but in 2020, when everything is different, I won't be ringside for it. Covid-19 quarantine regulations in my state (N.J.) mean I can't make the trip to Tryon, N.C., where WIHS has been moved from the pandemic restrictions imposed in Washington, D.C., that made

it impossible to stage the show there. Many shows can't be held this year, but Washington's most important classes are continuing, thanks to the sponsorship of MARS Equestrian $^{\text{TM}}$.

At the Tryon International Equestrian Center, the President's Cup is being held outdoors instead of indoors; in the afternoon, instead of at night, and without the diverse group of spectators who have been such a big part of its prestige. We can hope the 2020 victor will be remembered for having handled a challenge as impressively as the other competitors whose names are engraved on the venerable trophy.

At least we all will be able to watch the virtual rendition of the class, even if we're thousands of miles away. It won't be the same, of course, but at least it's happening and the tradition continues.

WITH AWARD-WINNING PHOTOJOURNALIST NANCY JAFFE

Award-winning photojournalist and Practical Horseman contributor Nancy Jaffer edited the U.S. Equestrian Team Foundation's book Riding for the Team: Inspirational Stories of the USA's Medal-Winning Equestrians and Their Horses. The book chronicles the lives of those who dreamed about competing for their country and "made it," sharing inspirational stories from the eight equestrian disciplines. Readers are immersed in the personal histories of the medal-winning riders, drivers and vaulters who have dominated American equestrian sport over the past 28 years.

In a recent episode of the Practical Horseman podcast, Nancy recounts anecdotes from the lives of Olympians Kent Farrington, Karen O'Connor and Debbie McDonald.

It seemed that several of the riders had talked about the mental aspect of the game and never giving up when into the pressure—whether it was in competition or making horses work. One that comes to mind is Kent Farrington. He had talked about in this sport so many things are out of your control and what's in your control is managing your horses and having people around you to support them.

An example of Kent and his really tough gogetter attitude is he was injured when he fell off a horse he didn't know very well. His leg was broken and he started rehabbing as soon as the operation was over and he's been winning ever since. He just doesn't take 'no' for an answer. It's a funny story about Kent because for Christmas when he was a child, he and his sister got plastic horses. Well, neat, something nice to find under the Christmas tree, but not for Kent, he gave his to his sister and said, 'I can't

ride a plastic horse in the Olympics.' As it turns out, his real present was a pony and his parents took him out to see him. But that was an example that even as a child, he knew what he wanted to do and, of course, he wound up doing it.

In Karen O'Connor's section, she talks about Biko and Teddy, who were for sure very different in size and stature and I know you know those horses well, could you talk a little bit about them?

Teddy was a pony and that made him such a crowd-pleaser. Who thinks a pony could go around a five-star at Kentucky? I remember Jane Atkinson, who ran Rolex Kentucky for many years kept an eye on him and said that if he was ever struggling at any point she was going to have the stewards stop Karen so that he wouldn't overreach from what his ability was. But it turns out that his ability was just enough to do anything that he wanted. He was just a special horse and one that captured the crowd and anybody who watched him could see that because of his size, he was amazing and they became instant fans, I think.

Biko was just the polar opposite and a real tribute to Karen that she could ride both horses so well. Biko was absolutely huge and dynamic and took quite a bit of doing, shall we say. But he was one of the best horses ever that we've seen in eventing on the U.S. side. And he was "Horse of

the Year," and "Horse of the Century" for the 20th century because he was just so consistent. He was her horse at the 1996 Olympics. As a young horse, he was really feral. The horses in Ireland are often turned out for several years so they're not as accustomed to human contact as many of the horses that we raise here. It took her two years before she could get on without someone holding him.

And they're all so different when you think about it. The contrast between Teddy the pony and Biko was obvious because of their size, but you have to think about the contrast among all the horses that these very experienced riders are involved with because the personalities are different, the abilities are different and they have to suss them out and figure out what makes them tick and how to get the best out of them.

There's so many wonderful stories in this book. Are there any other stories that our listeners might find interesting?

I think the story of Debbie McDonald is inspiring because a lot of people don't realize that she was a hunter/jumper rider and doing quite well in California and she had a very bad fall. This was shortly after she had a baby and she was reluctant to keep jumping because it can be dangerous and she felt responsibility to her child. Her husband suggested that she go into dressage, which she had no experience at all with dressage. And she said, 'OK, I'm going to do it.' She went to Hilda Gurney, who was at that time a top trainer in California and had been on the 1984 Olympic team. She learned dressage

from the ground up and obviously was successful. She was a double-gold medalist at the 1999 Pan American Games and she came very close to an individual medal on the silver medal team at the 2002 World Equestrian Games and of course, she was on our bronze medal Olympic team at 2004 Games. Her advice was always that if you work hard every day, show up on time and give 100 percent to every single client and horse, you'll find that a lot of people will come and support you and you'll be very successful.







We all watched with bated breath last year at Capital One Arena as Laura Kraut clinched the victory in the \$136,300 Longines FEI Jumping World CupTM Washington for the President's Cup aboard the wonderful Selle Francais mare, Fleurette, owned by St. Bride's Farm. As is WIHS tradition, the most recent President's Cup winner is featured on the cover of the Official Show Program, depicted in a stunning oil painting by WIHS official artist Sharon Lynn Campbell.

These paintings, however, mean far more than the front of a booklet. They ensure that a moment lives on forever. They commemorate a huge victory. They celebrate the beauty of horses and the talent that goes into good riding.

Sharon Lynn Campbell is the artist behind the paintings on the posters that since 2015 have adorned walls in our homes and tack rooms. Following a successful career as a hunter-jumper rider competing along the east coast, Sharon's love for horses led to painting and eventually led to a flourishing career for more than 20 years. From her studio in Rochelle, Va., she works on private commissions and as the artwork as the official artist for several horse shows, including WIHS.

THE PROCESS

Sharon begins by selecting a subject, who in this case is the winner of the previous year's President's Cup. She then gathers a series of candid and jumping shots of the pair, which she reviews and narrows to only a few photos. "At this point, I involve the WIHS team and we decide on the final pose together," she explains. "Once I'm all set with a general look, feel and plan, I am ready to jump into it and paint."

Sharon is a staunch advocate of oil paints, which she feels produce the richest and most vivid color schemes. Color, as she explains, is a vital though malleable tool in terms of displaying lighting and depth.

"When choosing a reference photo I always know that I am able to change colors, backgrounds, etc. with my paintbrush," she says. "Most of the reference photos for my clients' portraits are altered in some way."

Thus, Sharon and the WIHS team decided to depict Laura in a blue jacket. Because the lighting was bright on Fleurette's coat, they chose a dark background, which creates a beautiful contrast and makes her pop off the canvas.

"I like to keep backgrounds simple in most cases so that the subject is the focal point, though sometimes it may be according to the decor of the room where it's going to hang."

How does Sharon feel about her latest portrait? "I'm so pleased with how the colors and layout show the depth of Laura and Fleurette on the canvas," she said. "It's amazing that though compositions may be similar, each painting has its own uniqueness."

WIHS was thrilled with this year's stunning and dramatic portrait, adding to the wonderful collection of WIHS President's Cup winners. How does this latest portrait fit in with the gallery of WIHS President's Cup portraits by Sharon? You decide!

The 2020 WIHS Regional Horse Show and USHJA Zone 3 Championship presented by TTR Sotheby's International Realty concluded on Sunday, Oct. 18, at Morven Park International Equestrian Center highlighted by the presentation of the Laura Pickett Excellence in Horsemanship Award to 17-year-old Kayla Wolfe of Burke, Va.

The Laura Pickett Trophy for Excellence in Horsemanship was donated to the Washington International Horse Show (WIHS) by Vicki Lowell and created in memory of a very special equestrian and trainer – Laura Pickett.

Pickett lost her fight against breast cancer at just 52 years of age, after a five-year battle. The Trophy honors her contributions to the sport she loved and the legacy she left behind. She inspired enthusiasm for life, in addition to good horsemanship, and her award is presented to an "up and coming" rider who best exhibits the same qualities. Of those nominated, Wolfe rose to the top and was presented the honor from WIHS Project Coordinator Lara McPherson.

"While showing on the local circuit over the years I have learned how much Laura Pickett meant to the riding community, and it is such an honor to be a recipient of this award and carry on her name and what she stood for," said Wolfe, who is a senior at Bishop Ireton High School in Alexandria, Va., and is verbally committed to compete on the University of California, Davis Equestrian Team next year.

This year, Wolfe is serving her fourth term as a member of the WIHS Junior Committee and recalls attending Barn Night, watching the Laura Pickett Excellence in Horsemanship Award presentation, and dreaming of one day being a part of WIHS. Since then, Wolfe's dream has come true and she even finished in the ribbons of the 2016 WIHS Children's Hunter Championship.

Wolfe, who trains with Kristin Mangum, competed in the USHJA Zone 3 3'3" Junior Hunter Final on her own Sobri-K at the WIHS Regional Horse Show, noting, "2020 is so different and unexpected, but the [WIHS] Regional Horse Show went on beautifully at a gorgeous venue. It's awesome to see people who do the local shows and the "A" shows come together for a great event."

In the competition ring at the WIHS Regional Horse Show, riders were

Highlighting the equitation ranks, Grace Walker of Rixeyville, Va, rode lpache, owned by Jai Smith Rezac, to the VHSA/EMO Children's Medal victory, while Cailyn Durand of Richmond, Va., took home the MHSA/VHSA Children's Pony Medal riding Millpoint Farm's Prime Moment. Madison Busey of Ashburn, Va., and her own Queso Grande won the VHSA/EMO Adult Amateur Medal.

USHJA Highlighting Zone Championship jumper competition, Telina Tibbs of Great Falls, Va., riding Stanley 151, was crowned champion in the children's division, while Maryland's Cassie Lively and Quite A Journey were named reserve champion. For adult riders, top honors in the USHJA Zone 3 Adult Amateur Jumper Final were presented to Perri Freeman of Ellicott City, Md., and Dedwig while Wendy Libert of Hughesville, Md., and Can Can VI were reserve champions.

In the USHJA Zone 3 Championship hunter divisions, Annabella Bozzuto of Baltimore, Md., aboard Hamilton, owned by Bozzuto Equine, LLC, collected the championship in the Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under Final, while Olivia Dougherty of Arlington, Va., took reserve on At Last. For 15-17 riders, Emma Hyde of Reisterstown, Md., and Saumur, owned

by Twilight Equestrian, LLC, topped the list, while Allison Hines of Henrico, Va., riding Hugh Turner's Swagger earned reserve.

Agnes Hahn of Richmond, Va., was named champion in the USHJA Zone 3 3'3" Junior Hunter Final riding Cansas, and Grace Walker on Caleesi split the reserve title with Caroline Booker of Charlottesville, Va., on Final Four, owned by Emmaline Booker.

The USHJA Zone 3 Adult Amateur Hunter 18-35 Final was topped by Kristin Finkelstein of Reisterstown, Md., aboard



Mexicali Blue. Ellen Herrington of Memphis, TN, took reserve riding Pumba. The tricolor in the USHJA Zone 3 Adult Amateur Hunter 35 and Over Final went to Rachel Howell of Arlington, Va., and Flirtation Walk for owner Quiet Haven Farm, LLC. Christina Brady piloted I.P.A. to reserve honors.

Leading the charge for the Zone 3 Small and Medium Children's Hunter Ponies was Abbygale Hamilton on Starbound with Virginia Harris, who hails from Virginia, taking reserve on Pescado. The Zone 3 Large Children's Hunter Pony tricolor went to Tessa Brandon of Vienna, Va., on GF Aurelia, while reserve was presented to Eliza Laviolette of Ashburn, Va., riding Gotta Get Rockin.

RELLY WILKINSON COFFIN DESIGNS FIRST WIHS REGIONAL HORSE SHOW POSTER

Kelly Wilkinson Coffin of Ruckersville, Va., is the artist behind the WIHS Regional Horse Show's first official poster. Though a lifelong lover of horses and art, Kelly only began to pursue her interests professionally about 20 years ago following a distinguished career as a Naval Aviator and airline pilot.

If her last name looks familiar, that may be because she's married to Tad Coffin, the renowned Olympic eventing gold-medalist and saddlemaker, and supporter of the WIHS Equitation Finals, with whom she shares a passion for riding and a mission to celebrate the relationship between horse and rider.

Kelly spent most of her childhood in Arlington, Va., an urban area where riding was not readily available. Growing up, she was a self-described "frustrated, horse-crazy city girl." "I used to go to WIHS every year with my three closest friends," she recounts. "It was such a joy to have the horses come to us."

One WIHS memory in particular stands out: When she was in 5th grade, she saw the horse that starred in the classic 1979 film, The Black Stallion, the featured attraction that year.

She also adored hunt night and the big jumper classes. She recalls watching on the edge of her seat as Rodney Jenkins and Idle Dice sailed to victory in the President's Cup, instilling in her a lifelong love of the Thoroughbred.

From the time she was very young, Kelly channeled her passion into artwork. "I read lots of equestrian books and eventually started drawing horses." Though she couldn't ride more than once a week, Kelly made sure to get a "dose of horse" wherever she could. "My friends and I used to take the metro to D.C. and follow the Park Police around," she laughs, remembering the wonderful horses from the U.S. Park Police Mounted Unit.

Though she loved to paint, Kelly had no plans to pursue it professionally. After graduating from the University of Virginia on a Naval ROTC scholarship, she became a Naval Aviator, serving two tours in the Middle East. She then became a First Officer for US Airways, and continued to teach flying in the Naval Reserves until retiring after 20 years of service. Following the tragic events of 9/11, her career as an airline pilot was put on hold and she decided to devote herself to her other great love: painting.

Kelly's first step was to go back to school. She studied for three years at the Ingbretson Studio of Drawing and Painting in New Hampshire and spent one semester in Italy at the Charles Cecil Studio.

"After flying, it was a great blessing and comfort to devote myself to yet another passion," she says. "With a formal education, however, one's improvement in eye often precedes improvement in skill."

She became more discerning and less satisfied with her work. Just like equestrians, painters have their good days and their bad days. "But, no matter what," Kelly says, "you show up the next day and you do it again. Painting is a perishable skill; you can't take it for granted."

As an impressionist painter, Kelly often focuses less on individual details and more on the larger picture, first painting the prominent features and then working inward. She makes the most of each brushstroke, with emotion in every square inch of the piece.

"When I paint," she says, "I hope to convey a mood through color and light. I aim to capture the very thing that inspired me."

The Regional Show poster art is no exception. Kelly was watching a client of her husband's when she witnessed a quiet yet impelling moment. Marley, a young girl, stood with her pony, Patch, evoking an emotion Kelly felt she had to capture.

Most horse-lovers, she explains, would cite the tranquil and private moments with their horse as the most significant. "In truth, [the poster] is only loosely based on Marley and Patch. What I hope to capture is a relationship between child and pony."

This relationship, as she describes, is the essence of the partnership between horse and human with all extraneous factors stripped away. "Their connection is authentic and simple; it's about joy. And love. And hope. Something about seeing a girl and a pony--not only are they cute, but they are also a work in progress. They represent the future. In a similar vein, the Regional Show points towards WIHS."

Kelly began by painting a several smaller "studies" of the image, a technique she uses to develop her idea. In an earlier version, the subjects stood in front of a row of stalls, the famous D.C. skyline prominently behind them. However, she ended up painting them in a Regional Horse Show arena to better capture the atmosphere of the show itself.

"I thought, what do I like about the show? It shares a heritage with WIHS, but has its own unique characteristics. It provides an entrée to those who aspire to compete at WIHS. It's more casual and inclusive. Despite the differences between the two shows, it maintains traits central to the larger show: It's near D.C., it's an historic event, it's prestigious, and most importantly, it's fun."

Thus, it seemed fitting to include the logo on the jump behind the subjects. "The WIHS logo was fun; it meant painting a mini portrait of George Washington within the larger composition," Kelly says with a smile. "It's a great logo. Artists are always looking for little ways to challenge themselves like that." Also included in the background are pumpkins and a ribbon, adding vivid spots of color. Although the subject is still, the sky is vibrant, giving the image a sense of movement. The lighting sets the time of day and year. All of these components come together to tell the story of a girl and her pony having a great time at the show. "At the end of the day," she says, "that's what I aspire to be: a storyteller."




